10:00 am - 1:00 pm	<p>Guided walking tour</p> <p>•Underground Jerusalem -The Story of the Kishle Excavations</p> <p><i>Guided visit to the Kishle Excavations at David's Tower, Jaffa Gate, which was excavated by archaeologist Amit Re'em. The excavation which opened to the public in 2015, traces the six layers under the current Ottoman buildings and goes all the way back to King Hezekiah in the 8th Century BCE. Walk from the hotel to Jaffa Gate – the tour in the excavations is approximately 50 minutes.</i></p>	Departing from the King David Hotel
11:00 am - 1:30 pm	<p>Guided Walking Tours</p> <p>•Visit to Koresh 14 Gallery, Student Housing Project and Public Art Space</p> <p><i>Koresh is a non-profit organization promoting experimental contemporary art through exhibitions, workshops, talks and events. The building is both a residence and a public art space, which means that students create where they live. Guided by Hebrew University students and representatives from Hitorerut in Jerusalem, the tour will acquaint the visitors with student life in the City Center. The tour will be led by Prof. Amalya Oliver and Dr. Moran Pearl.</i></p> <p>(1.5 hours)</p> <p>•The Multi Ethnic Weave of Jerusalem</p> <p><i>Guided walk through the streets of Jerusalem exploring the weave of various religious and ethnic groups, how they live together... and apart. Beginning at the hotel, walk up Agron Street to King George, past the Great Synagogue and Yeshurun, on to Shmuel Hanagid Street, with a visit to the Ratisbonne Monastery, continuing to Narkis Street past the Baptist Church and on to Bezalel Street and the Nachalaot neighborhood, passing Batie Rand, ultraorthodox enclaves in the Nachalaot neighborhoods. Explore the nuances of Jewish observance in Nachalaot with a short "Headcovering Tour," and conclude on Agripas Street. If time allows, a walk through the empty Machane Yehudah Market for a short graffiti tour. Return to the hotel via Jaffa Road.
